As we continue to navigate the challenges and impacts of COVID-19, we want to remind our MSA family how critically important it is that we continue to pay attention to safety and practice established protocols.

The One Hanford move to mission-essential critical operations, followed by the current Phase 1 of remobilization continues to be an exceptional response to COVID-19 for employee safety. Leadership from the Department of Energy and Hanford Site contractors continue regular interfaces with local health officials and community leaders. Workforce safety remains our number one concern.

By following basic health guidelines, we can help protect ourselves, our loved ones, our co-workers and our community.

- Wear face coverings when outside of your homes. Face coverings have been required at Hanford since before remobilization began and wearing them consistently can help prevent the spread of COVID-19. With so many myths and questions regarding face coverings, we urge you to review [this update](#) from the Washington State Department of Health.
- Wash your hands frequently and use approved hand sanitizers.
- Avoid carpooling when not with your immediate family.
- Do not report to work if you are not feeling well – your minor symptoms could become someone else's major illness.
